 Expressive Arts and Design ELG: Being Imaginative and Expressive Invent, adapt and recount narratives and stories with peers and their teacher. Sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs. Perform songs, rhymes, poems and stories with others, and – when appropriate – try to move in time with music. 	 Weekly music lessons through Charanga. Charanga is used as a whole school music scheme. Every lesson in EYFS follows the same format of – listen and respond, explore and create, singing, share and perform. Autumn 1 – Me Autumn 2 - My Stories Spring 1 - Everyone Spring 2 - Our World Summer 1 - Big Bear Funk Summer 2 - Reflect, Rewind, Play 	 Charanga is used as a whole school music scheme. Every lesson in KS1 follows the same format of – listen and appraise, games, singing, playing, improvisation, composition, performance. Skills are progressive through the scheme as pupils move through the year groups.
	 Daily wake and shake. Daily routine songs e.g. days of the week song. Singing songs and rhymes from a variety of genres. Making and using musical instruments. Outdoor stage area to sing, use instruments and perform to peers. Nativity performance- singing, dancing and performing. Nursery rhymes linked to topics and books. Playing movement and listening games, using different sounds for different movements. Modelling how to tap rhythms to accompany words, such as tapping the syllables of names, objects, animals and the lyrics of a song. 	 Singing songs to support learning in different subjects e.g. number bonds song in maths. Christmas carol concerts and performances. End of year productions.
